Inter-Academic Report

National Academies of Medicine France and Mexico

2023 February

Educational Trajectories, Health and Longevity

During the first months of the SARS-COV-19 pandemic, the observation of divergent attitudes, ranging from total compliance with health rules to revolt against all preventive measures, led Dirk Van Damme, senior consultant at OEDC (Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development), to say that there was probably a relationship between the severity of the pandemic and the education of the populations (1). This statement was certainly related to a study conducted in the pre-pandemic period in 8 European countries, which showed that about 40% of the population in these countries had inadequate or problematic health education (2). Aware of the coexistence of several pandemics (SARS-COV-19, aging populations and chronic diseases), several academics from France and Mexico were alarmed by the possible deleterious effects on health of closing schools and universities (3). They asked two questions: How do basic education and health education affect our lifestyle, overall health and ability to age well from a very young age? What is the role of education in the onset and progression of the most common diseases in adulthood?

Summary

The working group of the Academies of Medicine of France and Mexico initiated its work after the first wave of the COVID 19 pandemic, during which the severity of the disease in certain countries was attributed to a lack of basic education of the population. The study continued and expanded to better understand the roles of basic education and health education on overall health and longevity. This work has demonstrated that, alongside genetics, the affective and educational family environment but also the general one greatly interferes from the very first days of life. Thus, epigenetics plays a major role in the determination of health and disease (DOHAD) as well as in the characterization of gender. Other factors such as socio-economic level, parental education, school in urban or rural areas play a major role in the differential acquisition of health literacy. This determines adherence or not to healthy lifestyles, risky behaviors, substance abuse, but also compliance with hygiene rules and adherence to vaccines and treatments. The combination of all these elements and lifestyle choices facilitates the emergence of metabolic disorders (obesity, diabetes) which promote cardiovascular and kidney damages and neurodegenerative diseases, explaining that the less educated have a shorter survival while they spend more years of life in disability. After having demonstrated the impact of the educational level on health and longevity, the members of the inter-academic group propose specific educational actions at three levels: 1) Children, their parents, and teachers, 2) health professionals and 3) aging people, after emphasizing that these crucial actions can only be carried out with the unfailing support of state and academic authorities.

Joint recommendations

These educational recommendations must respond to 2 imperatives, because education represents an absolute emergency: to promote better health education for the populations of France and Mexico: 1. To ensure the coherence of the educational messages on the priority themes of each country, the educational effort must have the full support of the constituted bodies (academic, diplomatic and political); 2. This consensual educational effort must be based on attractive, accessible, supportive and participatory communication strategies, accessible, supportive and participatory. The recommendations concern 3 target audiences: **1. Health and**

education professionals must be better trained in health in order to better understand the immense societal stakes involved in their messages and actions; **2. The school**, whose importance is immediately after that of the family, is a privileged place whose mission is to contribute to the development of basic skills allowing the full blossoming of children both in terms of overall health, mental health, well-being and educational success; **3. The general public: Parents:** the importance of education during the prenatal period and the first few months of life, which, along with environmental conditions, has a major impact on the entire health and life trajectory of children; **Young**

and active adults: simple, powerful and repetitive messages on hygiene, promotion of physical exercise and good habits of “healthy living” within the ecological framework of a “single health”; **Patients’ associations:** education especially oriented towards subjects at risk (obese, pre-diabetic, hypertensive, renal insufficiency, ...) and therapeutic education of patients as soon as their chronic diseases are discovered.

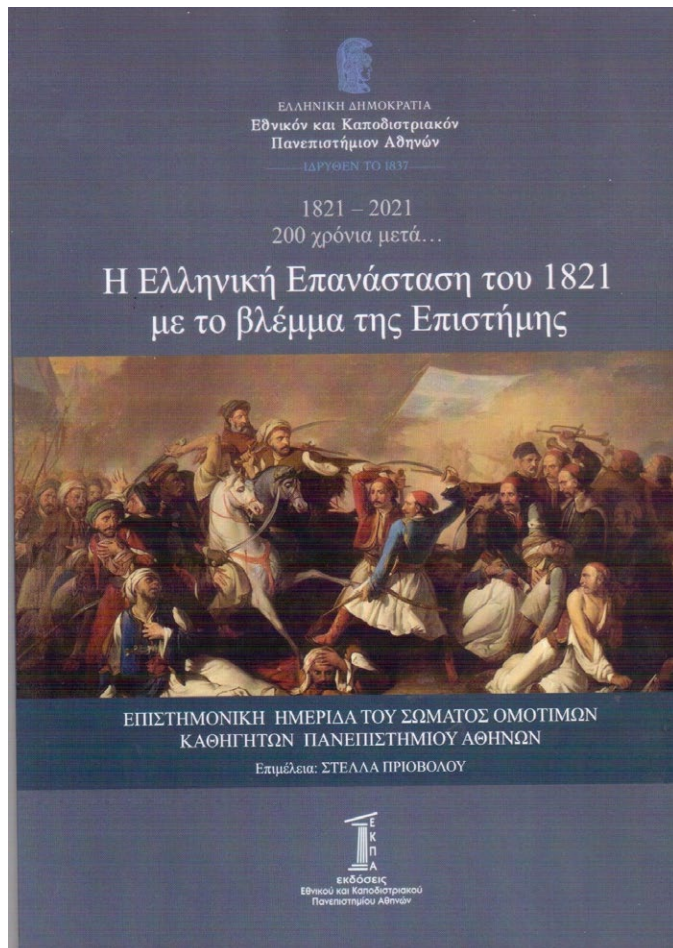

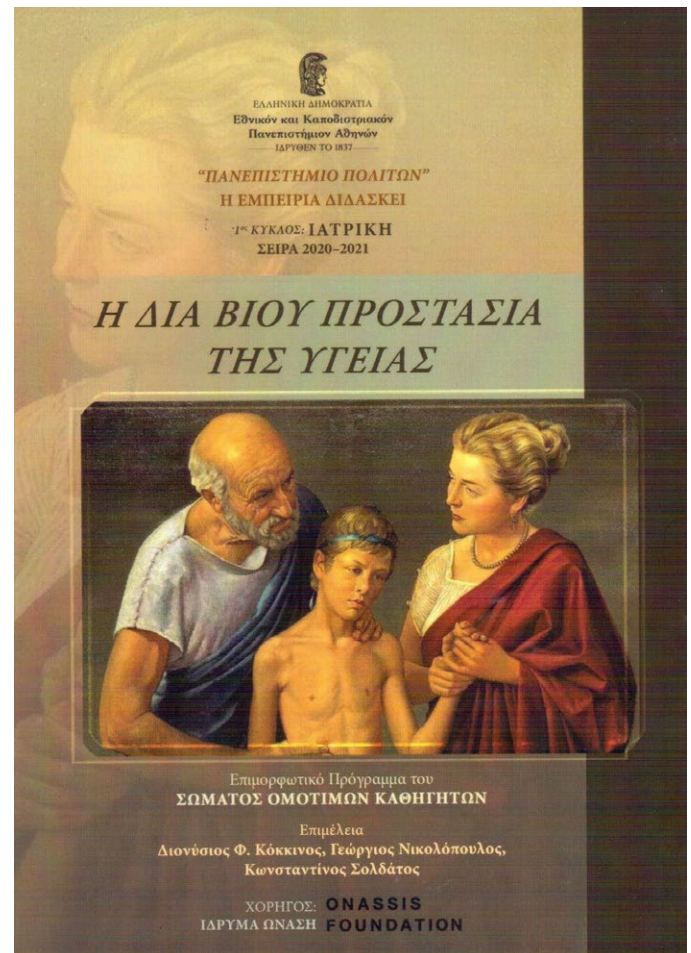
NEWS FROM THE ASSOCIATION OF PROFESSORS EMERITI OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ATHENS

THE “DELTOS” JOURNAL

We are proud to publish the English-language new version of the Greek journal “Deltos”, which in its original form was devoted exclusively to the history of Greek medicine. Its name is a derivation of the Greek letter delta (Δ in Greek), because this triangular shape made it easy to inscribe on wooden writing tablets covered with beeswax. This is where the English word deltiology comes from, i.e. the hobby of collecting postcards. The journal was launched in 1991 and has since become the only forum for the Greek history of medicine written in a very correct Greek language. It grew out of the Friends of the Museum for the History of Hellenic Medicine.

Its initial nucleus were Army Medical Officers and University Professors. The driving force was Grigorios Scampardonis (1935-2020), a cardiologist and at the end of his career a lieutenant colonel in the Army's Medical Division. With some wistfulness, it was decided to abandon the Greek language used by Hippocrates and Galen for their writings and to print Deltos in English to achieve a wider circulation. However, an abstract for each published article will be printed in Greek.

After elections four months ago a new Editorial Board and Scientific Committee were established.

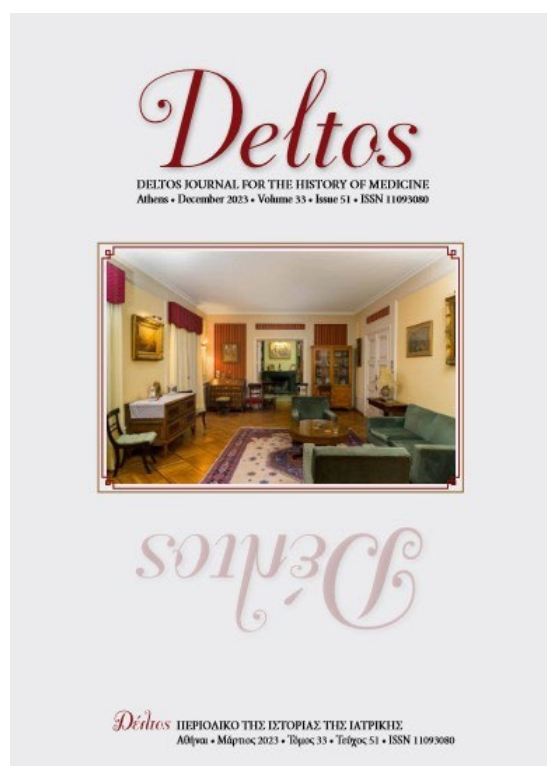


Professor Emeritus, Athanasios Diamandopoulos, a founding member of EAPE was appointed as editor-in-chief of Deltos. The journal will be open access, only on the internet, and will have two publications per year. We are now calling for original papers on the history of medicine and related sciences from Greece, the Old World, and the New World

and especially from the rest of the world. Our aim is to produce a high-quality issue to generate enthusiasm among researchers to submit articles to our journal. We would therefore greatly appreciate it if you could submit an original article on a topic that you find relevant to Deltos. Please find attached the instructions for authors.
